* Please Note:

Under the newly ratified Rules of the Association the term "**honorary**" no longer applies and has been replaced with the term "**Non-fee paying**".

Members eligible for the "non-fee paying" category are members 65 years and over, who have been a financial member for at least three consecutive years prior to turning 65.

Members who are 65 years of age and were not financial before their 65th birthday must pay fees for three consecutive years before they are eligible for a fee exemption irrespective of age.

FUTURE DIRECTIONS OF THE KASTELLORIZIAN ASSOCIATION OF VICTORIA.

On Sunday the 31st of August the Kastellorizian Association of Victoria held the "FUTURE DIRECTIONS OF THE ASSOCIATION SUMMIT".

After a great deal of promotion of this event in the editions November 2007 and April 2008 and July 2008 of the Kazzie News and a multitude of requests for volunteers to assist on the subcommittee for the future direction of the Association, it was extremely disappointing that only 25 members attended.

Despite the lack of numbers, the presentation went ahead. Feedback was limited due to the modest number of attendees. As a result, the lack of support at this event has made it very difficult for the Committee to reinvent and modernize the Association, as well as design and plan for well attended future functions and events.

The key to the future of the Association lies with the "Lost Generation" (30-55 year olds). No progress was made on how to attract this group of members to attend the Association's functions and become active at an administrative (committee) level.

How to interpret the lack attendance of the "Lost Generation" is open to interpretation. The most obvious message appears to be that lack of attendance equates to lack of interest thus implying that we are unable to rejuvenate the Association to attract younger members. This further highlights that the Association in its present form does not have a place in Melbourne Kazzie life. An interpretation of this result suggests that the days of the Association are numbered. How long it will survive is anyone's guess, but if we keep travelling along this path it may be soon.

On the other hand, there was a glimmer of hope as five youth members (16-30 years of age) attended the "Summit". The committee and the other attendees eagerly listened to their views and reasons for not attending the Association functions. The message that came across was that the Association was not relevant to them or that their parents had not educated them about the Association. It was identified that the lack of education of the children by the parents was partly due to lack of activities for the children to participate in.

This highlighted the need to engage members with children under 12 and to fill the void by continuing to provide relevant activities for children 12 to 18 years of age. It is clear that to be successful, we require the assistance of parents who have children in this age group to participate in the organisation of children's activities. Undoubtedly this would assist in making the activities relevant and interesting. Once again there was no offer of assistance or constructive advice on how to achieve this.

At the end of the day, the five youths decided to investigate formulating a youth club. However they were keen to do so independently of the Association. In the end they agreed to liaise through committee member Evelyn Salvaris in order to maintain loose connection with the Association. Further details of their first function can be found in the Kazzie Youth Column.

GREEK CULTURE

Timon

Timon lived on Kastellorizo some 3000 years ago (about 1000 B.C.). He was a sailor whose sailing ship carried produce of Asia Minor to the ports and islands of Eastern Europe. Timon was also know to do a little pirating on the side.

The world that Timon lived was harsh and full of danger and uncertainty. Men like Timor who were bold enough to travel and trade, were at the mercy of the elements and the savagery of their competitors. They were superstitious and prayed to the spirits for protection.

Timon was successful enough to build a monument to himself. However he was not on good terms with his compatriots and also had issues with his family. Thus he gave them a warning of what to expect if they defaced his monument. We know this from the inscription on a rock that was discovered by two Austrian archeologists, Hetesy and Kalinga, in 1895. The rock is situated at the entrance of Kastellorizo's harbor and is locally known as "Koutsomaston".

Unfortunately, age and erosion has changed the shape of the rock, but careful observation shows that the rock was an alter on which offerings to the Gods were deposited. Parts of the inscription are still readable and their free translation is given below.

"It is Timon, who built this monument in memory of this beautiful harbor because he knows that his family, his house and his children do not respect him enough to build him a monument after his death. He built it himself with images of the subterranean Gods in perpetual memory

But you traveler, who sails by on your boat, hail..... you foreigner,"

Unfortunately the most spicy parts are missing, but further down another message is carved, possibly by somebody in authority after Timon died, or perhaps by Timon himself.

It reads: " This is the memorial of Timon, no-one is to do it injustice or to erase it because in it are demons and subterranean Gods."

Oh Timon you must have been some man. So when you are next on Kastellorizo and have nothing to do, go to "Koutsomaston" and say "Hello" to him, but please respect the wishes he made 3000 years ago.

Michelle has planned both functions today down to the last details. Tables decorated in filmy green fabric that catches the breeze, small jars of hand made sugared candied orange peel, the candles creating a lovely atmosphere in the dusk. The air is balmy after the heat of the afternoon and Kiosoglous and Adgemis relations have gathered from around the world. Cousins from Greece, England and Australia (Melbourne, Sydney, Perth, Queensland) are for the 70th birthday. This is possibly the most elaborate function the island has seen.
